What welfare problems might PAT dogs & cats be exposed to?

- A unique set of potential welfare issues related to undertaking therapeutic visits with dogs and cats
- Risks from the environment, the people and the interactions or tasks that the animal encounters

The new Animal Welfare Act

- Came into force in April 2007
- Replaces old-fashioned and outdated legislation
- Designed to prevent possible neglect and abuse, so is proactive, rather than reactive
- Assigns a "duty of care" to all pet owners to ensure that their pet's basic needs are met
- Based upon the Five Freedoms

What are the "Five Freedoms?"

Designed in 1965, they were originally a framework for assessing farm animal welfare

Freedom from.....

- Pain, injury & disease
- Discomfort
- Fear & distress
- Hunger & thirst

Freedom to.....

- Express normal patterns of behaviour
